Background

Throughout history thousands of people have organized co-ops across the US and across the world. Why? What worked and what hasn't worked? What can we learn from their stories?

As co-op developers it is helpful to have a historical grounding in cooperative movements and milestones. Co-op history is rich. But where to start? Let's look at key cooperative advances from the perspective of what motivates people to come together to organize cooperatives. A look at motivations may help inform the work we undertake in our communities.

To make the most of our time together, training participants will be assigned to explore <u>one</u> historical movement. As time allows, feel free to research a little or a lot about your assigned historical topic. The goal isn't to become an expert, but to help start the conversation. A motivating factor is attached to each of these historical movements (though there could be multiple rationales). Motivations are an interesting lens to view history. As you explore your assigned co-op movement, prepare to share your reflections on two questions:

- 1. What are your thoughts about this co-op movement? (For example: What was the context? Who was involved? What lessons can be applied to today?)
- 2. Can you think of any historical or contemporary examples of other co-ops that have organized for similar motivations? (For example: Is this motivation relevant to your work? Who faces similar situations?)
